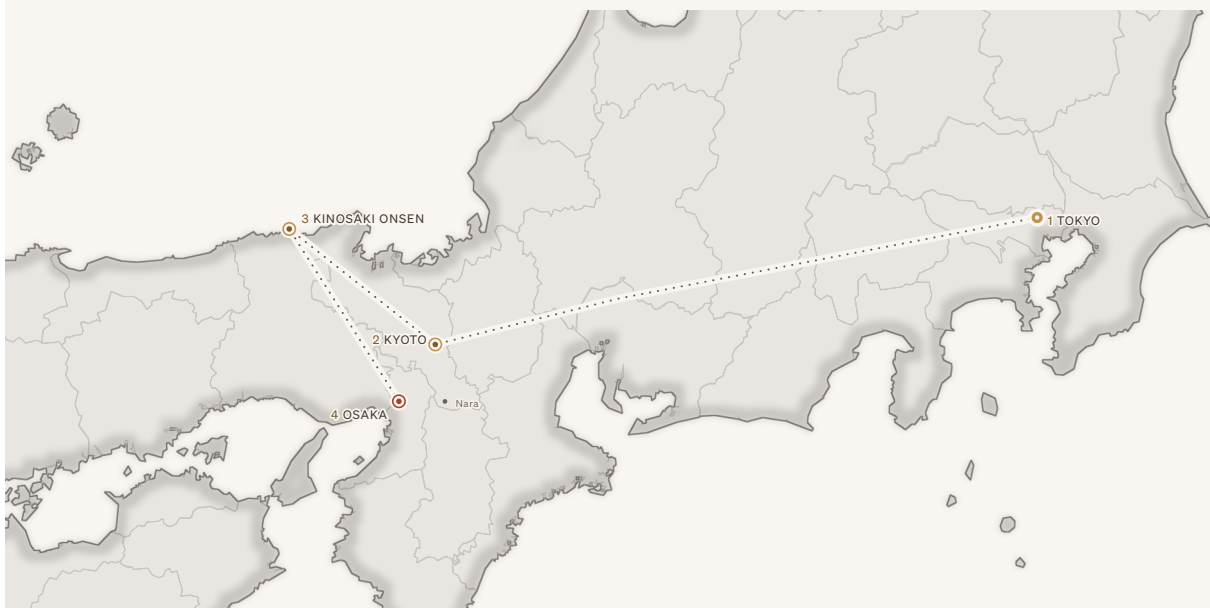

From Tokyo to Osaka, by way of *Kinosaki*

Classic Japan is Essential Japan with the two nights a first visit tends to miss: a ryokan at Kinosaki Onsen, the hot spring town near the Sea of Japan coast where guests walk the canal in yukata from one public bathhouse to the next. Three nights in Tokyo and three in Kyoto come first; two in Osaka close the journey. The Shinkansen carries you in the Green Car from Tokyo to Kyoto, the limited express takes you over the Tamba hills to Kinosaki and back down to Osaka, and a private chauffeur meets you at the airport at both ends.

Nara is taken as a day from Kyoto, paired with Fushimi Inari on the same road south. Two evenings in Kyoto are left open, with your Tour Director's recommendations booked on request.



THE ROUTE BY NIGHT, TOKYO, KYOTO, KINOSAKI ONSEN, OSAKA

TOKYO THREE NIGHTS	Nihonbashi, the merchant quarter from whose bridge every road in Japan was once measured.
KYOTO THREE NIGHTS	Gion, the geiko district below the eastern hills, with Kiyomizu-dera a short walk above it.
KINOSAKI ONSEN TWO NIGHTS	A ryokan on the canal, in a town that has bathed in its springs since the eighth century.
OSAKA TWO NIGHTS	Beside the castle park, in the city the Edo period called the kitchen of the nation.

Eleven *days*

Because you choose the dates, we arrange the order of the days around them: several of these places keep a regular closing day (the Imperial Palace East Gardens close on Mondays and Fridays), and the sequence is set so that each is open on the day you visit.

DAY 1
TOKYO

A private chauffeur meets you at Narita or Haneda and takes you and your luggage to your hotel in Nihonbashi. Your Tour Director joins you that evening for the welcome dinner.

DAY 2
TOKYO

Late in the morning you walk the Tsukiji Outer Market with your Tour Director, eating as you go, from rolled omelette to the tuna cut at the counter. In the afternoon the Imperial Palace East Gardens, laid out within the inner citadel of Edo Castle, then Ginza in the late afternoon, and a sushi counter for dinner.

DAY 3
TOKYO

Senso-ji and the lanes of Asakusa, with a visit to a craft studio in the district; then Meiji Jingu, whose forest of a hundred thousand trees, planted by hand a century ago, is now taken for ancient woodland. Shibuya Crossing in the early evening, three thousand people to a green light, and an izakaya for dinner.

DAY 4
KYOTO

The Green Car of the Shinkansen to Kyoto, a little over two hours. An afternoon on foot in Higashiyama: Kiyomizu-dera on its wooden stage above the valley, then down the stone lanes of Sannenzaka and Ninenzaka to your hotel in Gion. Gion with your Tour Director as the lanterns are lit; the evening is yours.

DAY 5
KYOTO

Kinkaku-ji, its two upper storeys leafed in gold above the pond, then the bamboo grove at Arashiyama. In the afternoon a private tea ceremony, and kaiseki for dinner.

DAY 6
KYOTO

Fushimi Inari, where the vermilion gates climb the hill behind the shrine, then on to Nara: Todai-ji, whose Great Buddha Hall is among the largest wooden buildings in the world, and the deer park around it. Lunch in Nara, and on the way back a sake tasting in Fushimi, the brewing district on Kyoto's southern edge, built on its soft spring water. Dinner is left open, with your Tour Director's recommendations.

DAY 7 KINOSAKI ONSEN	Nishiki Market on foot with your Tour Director, tasting as you go along the covered street Kyoto has shopped in for four centuries, then the limited express north over the Tamba hills to Kinosaki Onsen, about two and a half hours. At the ryokan you change into yukata, take the first of the town's seven bathhouses, and dinner is served in the ryokan.
DAY 8 KINOSAKI ONSEN	Kinosaki at leisure with your Tour Director: the seven public bathhouses, each with its own character, and the willow-lined canal between them, walked in yukata and wooden geta as the town intends. From November to March the town's table is the Matsuba crab landed at Tsuiyama, twenty minutes away. Dinner is at the ryokan.
DAY 9 OSAKA	The limited express south to Osaka, and Osaka Castle, a short walk from your hotel, in the afternoon: Hideyoshi's fortress, its keep rebuilt in 1931 on the Tokugawa walls. Dotonbori, the canal street cut in 1615, on foot with your Tour Director in the evening, and a sushi counter for dinner.
DAY 10 OSAKA	Kuromon Market late in the morning, lunching from stall to stall through the covered arcade that has supplied the city's kitchens since the Edo period; the afternoon at ease. A farewell dinner of wagyu teppanyaki at the hotel.
DAY 11 DEPARTURE	Breakfast, and a private chauffeur to Kansai or Itami for your flight.

TEN NIGHTS	Mitsui Garden Hotel Nihonbashi Premier [*] , Tokyo, three nights Hotel The Celestine Kyoto Gion [*] , Kyoto, three nights Nishimuraya Honkan [*] or Nishimuraya Hotel Shogetsutei [*] , Kinosaki Onsen, two nights Hotel New Otani Osaka [*] , Osaka, two nights
MEALS	Breakfast every day. Eight dinners: the welcome dinner, a sushi counter in Tokyo, an izakaya evening, kaiseki in Kyoto, two dinners at the ryokan in Kinosaki, a sushi counter in Osaka and the farewell teppanyaki. Three lunches, at Tsukiji, in Nara and at Kuromon, and the tastings at Nishiki.
TRAVEL	A private chauffeur at the airport on arrival and on departure. The Green Car on the Shinkansen from Tokyo to Kyoto, and on the limited express from Kyoto to Kinosaki and from Kinosaki to Osaka. A private car and driver on the days in Tokyo, Kyoto and Nara that the rail cannot do. Luggage sent ahead between hotels.
EXPERIENCES	A private tea ceremony in Kyoto. A sake tasting in Fushimi. A craft studio visit in Asakusa. The market walks at Tsukiji, Nishiki and Kuromon with your Tour Director. The seven public bathhouses of Kinosaki. Every entry on the plan.
YOUR TOUR DIRECTOR	A Tour Director with you every day, from the welcome dinner to the last morning, fluent in Japanese and English, so that every reservation, check-in and conversation on the ground is handled on our side.
THE EXTENSION HIROSHIMA AND MIYAJIMA	Three days, \$7,200 per person. The last day of the journey becomes a travel day: the Green Car from Osaka to Hiroshima in about ninety minutes, and the afternoon given to the Peace Memorial Park and Museum. The next day is Miyajima: the ferry across, Itsukushima Shrine and its great torii standing in the water, and the lanes of the island, with lunch and dinner. On the third day, Shukkei-en, the garden laid out for the Asano lords in 1620, then the afternoon at ease and a farewell dinner. On the fourth morning a private chauffeur takes you to Hiroshima Airport, or the Green Car takes you to Osaka or Tokyo for your flight. Three nights at Hotel Granvia Hiroshima [*] , breakfast every day, and the meals named here. With the extension, Classic Japan is fourteen days.

BOOKING
